ANNUAL SPEECH DAY 2015 - 2016

On Friday, 9 December 2016, Sir Ellis Kadoorie Secondary School (West Kowloon) celebrated students' academic achievements and excellence in extra-curricular activities in the 2015-2016 school year on their annual Speech Day.

The ceremony began with the Principal's report on students' pleasing results in the HKDSE and GCE (AS) Level Examinations. Among the



outstanding achievers was Sit Wai Hang of 6A, who achieved the best HKDSE results.

She next moved on to report on the illustrious list of accolades in various extra-curricular domains. At the 65th

Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival, students won Championships in Boys Solo Verse Speaking and in Bible Reading. At the Hong Kong School Drama Festival and English Drama Fest, students won four awards for Outstanding Performers and two awards for Outstanding Scripts. In the Hong Kong School Sports Federation Inter-school Football Competition, the school's sports team was first runners-up, while in the Inter-school Rugby Sevens Competition as well as the Girls' and Boys' C Grade Rugby Don't Drop the Ball Tournament, the teams were crowned Champions. At the 52nd Schools Dance Festival Competition, the school's Jazz and Modern Dance team and Oriental Dance team garnered three prestigious awards.

Certificates were presented to the hardworking students by various honorable guests in attendance, including the Chief School Development Officer (YTM) Ms. HO Mo-ki and members of the School Management Committee, Managing Directors of Ruttonjee Estates Continuation Limited, and Chairperson of the Hong Kong Indian Women's Club.



The guest speaker, Mr. Peter O.K. Lam, Managing Director of Inno Tech Engineering Limited, delivered a fascinating and insightful speech to the audience. He spoke about the unlimited wisdom of kids, and passed on

a number of key points of advice, including embracing a never-give-up fighting spirit, being kind and following one's instincts in decision-making.

The Head Girl, Vinny, delivered an inspirational summary of students' learning opportunities at school, describing the valuable opportunities they have to develop their potential and appreciate cultural diversity.

The audience was entertained by a variety of student performances, including solo verse speaking in English, Putonghua and Cantonese, vibrant oriental and Bhangra dances, and a wonderful rendition by the school choir of one of Elvis Presley's hit songs, Can't Help Falling in Love with You. The morning ended with the rousing rendition of the school song, before guests, parents and prize winners proceeded to the mini hall for a delectable assortment of refreshments prepared by students.

Overall, the entire day was tiring but enjoyable as everyone mingled and took part in discussions freely.


P.6 Information Day




Enhanced Smart Teen Project 2016-2017

Powered By Youth Forum 2016 and Act!on for A Cause Pitching Competition

On 12 and 19 November 2016, 8 S2 students were invited to join the ‘Powered by Youth Forum (PBY) 2016’ together with over 100 students from both local and international schools at the Australian International School, Kowloon Tong. PBY is the only youth event in Hong Kong that adopts local community-led model of sustainable development with a global perspective. The forum not only enabled the integration of students from different backgrounds across Hong Kong, but also introduced several main themes which might be overlooked in the traditional school curriculum. Adopting a peer-to-peer training model, PBY aims at engaging youths in real life social issues, encouraging creative problem-solving in social issues and providing learning opportunities for like-minded youths across the community. At the forum, the participants learned from inspiring keynote speakers and worked with professional facilitators in the break-out planning sessions. The ‘Power Group’ focused on personal strengths while the ‘Passion Group’ targeted at social issues. The issues included environmental



protection, urban revitalization and social equality. The groups then utilized their new found power and passion to implement their own Community Action Projects. The participants were offered an opportunity to present their ideas and projects to a panel of judges. The winning teams were offered a starting fund of HK\$5,000 and support by a professional mentor to bring their ideas to the community.

There were more than 12 teams from both local and international schools joining the ‘Act!on for a Cause’ Pitching Competition pitching their ideas to the judges. 
