

Speech Day

he Annual School
Speech Day
(2000/2001) was
held at 10:30 a.m.
on 14th December 2001
(Friday). The Guest of
Honour was Deputy Director

The ceremony ran smoothly
and the whole day was a
great success.

The ceremony started with the procession of the official party onto the stage. After the audience was seated, the Principal delivered the school annual report. He stated that it has made us proud to have put our school mission into practice, that "we have in the past year provided various learning experiences through numerous extra-curricular activities" and that all these "had the common purpose of developing our students' allroundedness and multiple intelligences together with a sense of social awareness



and responsibility." The Guest of Honour was then invited to distribute prizes to students who excelled either in academic subjects or in extra-curricular activities. Awards were also given to students who rendered services to the school. In his speech, Mr. Anthony TONG remarked that in the past few years, he hadn't met students so lively and responsive as ours.

The entertainment programs that followed won great applause and appreciation from the audience. Three of our students recited English Verses, two of which came first in the 53rd Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival and one which obtained the "International Poet Award". There were also poems in Hindi, Urdu and French. This year, a Chinese poem was added. It was presented in the form of a drama. The performers included not only Chinese but also Indian, Pakistani and Filipino students. This is very encouraging to both the students and parents, reflecting that our students are talented in language learning, and even non-Chinese students can learn

Drug Education Weeks

Learning for life! To enable our students to have a better understanding of the harmful effects of drugs and to advise them to keep away from drugs, School Discipline Committee, Guidance & Couseling Committee and the school social worker held the Drug Education Weeks, a series of programs on "Say No to Drugs", from November to December for our students. Speakers from Kely Support Group, Against Drug Abuse Scheme Team (II) SWD, Community Drug Advisory Council and Christian Zheng Sheng College were invited to give talks to and conduct workshops with our students.

With the help of the English Club and Art Club, through writing and poster design competitions, the Secondary One students took lots of small gifts home, together with names and pictures of different drugs and knowledge of their harmful effects on their health.

friends if they offered you drugs at a party?" Secondary Two students were given workshops and taught the necessary skills to assertively reject drugs offered to them by their peers.

Watching videos about past experience of drug addicts, our senior students were informed of situations which might make them vulnerable to the risk of taking drugs. A lively and interactive sharing-session on "Being a Drug-free Student" was conducted by students from the Christian Zheng Sheng College who had joined a drug withdrawal program. Their positive message and sharing made it clear how important it is to

treasure what we have and what we should strive for.

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Careers Guidance

'When I was just a little girl, I asked my mother, "What will I be? Will I be. . . ." When you listen to this, do you ask yourself what your dream is, what your ambition is and what you will be after graduation? Our S5 students are now thinking about these questions. They are also very lucky, for they are more likely to have their dreams fulfilled as they are introduced to various organizations that can help them to acquire skills and knowledge to pursue their career goals. In November and December, led by the Careers teachers,

S5 students visited the Information Centre of the Labour Department in Wan Chai and participated in the Second Young Leaders' Forum held at the Hong Kong Exhibition and Convention Centre, where they obtained knowledge about the world of work.

The Careers Guidance and Counseling Committee looks after not only S5 students but also S4 students. In December, they attended a talk in our school hall organized jointly by the Committee and the Vocational Training Council. Through a slide show and lively talk given by Mr. Ma Tak Ming, a

Vocational Training Officer, our students learnt that they have a vast choice of courses which can lead them to different industries. For instance, they can take training courses to be a qualified chef in Chinese cuisine, a designer, an automobile jewellery technician or an employee of the electrical, electronics, gas, printing or textile industries, to mention just a few. These courses range from certificate to diploma level. Students were reminded that the better the Chinese language skills they possess, the more choices they will have, as well as a better chance of admission to the courses.

Results of the 53rd Hong Kong Schools

It was very encouraging to both students and teachers when good results were obtained in the 53rd HK Schools Speech Festival. There were forty-one students participating in three categories: English Solo Verse Speaking, Prose Sight-Reading (Open) and Dramatic

Duologue. Two students were awarded Honours Certificates, thirty-one obtained Merit Certificates and seven students obtained Proficiency Certificates.

Computerization of Student ID Cards

A new, computerized student identity card with the use of a bar code system has been designed by the school IT team and is already in use.

The new student identity card will be used as a student library card when the school library is in full automation. It can also capture, keep, retrieve and analyse all necessary data, including the discipline record, number of times late, etc., of a student by using a bar code scanner.

Comparatively, the old system was rather laborious and time-consuming in recording the student's
