



# Hong Kong Air Cadet Corps — A unique life-long learning opportunity for SEKSS(WK) students

High flying youth dedicated to Hong Kong's future

It has long been the wish of the Principal, the teachers and the students to form a uniformed team in order to expose the students to both discipline training and the "outside world."

After much exploration, planning and organization, our Geography teacher, Mr CHAN Vai-sam,



made arrangements so that the Hong Kong Air Cadet Corps would come to our school to establish an Air Cadet unit and to train our students. On 19 November 2002, 50 of our students pledged to become members of the Hong Kong Air Cadet Corps, in order to contribute to the public welfare of Hong Kong whilst building up their leadership skills and good moral character. These students are now members of Flight 6002 with Mr Chan Vai-Sam, Ms Lui Man Fei and Ms Wong Sau Yi as Officer Cadets.

What attracted the students was not only the training in aviation knowledge, the foot-drills, and the smart uniform. The exciting activities, which will all be conducted in English, will include flights on government helicopters, rifle drills, campcraft, field exercises, summer canoe courses and other aquatic activities. The number of

students joining far exceeded expectations. Although the cadets have only had a few training sessions since November, they impressed all the guests with their special 'welcome' on Speech Day.

Besides the services they have given to the school, they also took part in cleaning the Tsim Sha Tsui Cultural Centre on New Year's Day, showing real community spirit. In January, they will visit the Hong Kong Government Flying Services Headquarters in Chek Lap Kok. They will also have the chance to receive aviation education. If they excel themselves, they may be selected to represent Hong Kong in the International Air Cadet Exchange Program (IACE).

It is hoped that more students will join the cadets in coming years to enjoy the exciting activities on offer.

### **School Intranet**

In early December of 2002, our school successfully installed an intranet system – "<a href="http://www.seksswk.edu.hk/itschool/">http://www.seksswk.edu.hk/itschool/</a>". The system revolutionizes our way of communication and teaching.

First, all our staff, as well as students, have their own e-mail accounts so that internal communication becomes more comprehensive and



efficient. Second, teachers can upload their learning materials onto the intranet so that the students can access the learning materials whenever they are online. Teachers can also send assignments to the students through the intranet system and give them

immediate feedback. Third, all the school notices and internal circulars can be posted onto the intranet system so that the staff can easily keep in touch with school

events and up-to-date information. Then the school administration can utilize the intranet system to improve their management with faster and better communication.
