Message from the Principal Mrs. Yeung Kwong Mong Ha

With the dedicated support from our parents throughout the year, Sir Ellis Kadoorie Secondary School has been progressing as the positive school culture is reinforced through a series of specially designed school improvement plans. The past year has been a fruitful one with students receiving various prizes and awards during the year, and more importantly, seven of our S.6 students were admitted to degree courses in the University of Hong Kong.

Building on our well-established multicultural learning environment, various new programmes will be arranged for our students this year.

- (a) For S1, ECA & Chinese Culture Appreciation and Sports Training are arranged for students after school on Mondays and Wednesdays respectively. Through the programmes, the newcomers are able to enjoy school life and their sense of belonging can definitely be enhanced. Mathematics tutorial class will be arranged in small groups for them during lunch time every Friday to consolidate their understanding in Mathematics.
- (b) STEM lessons (STEM is the combination of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Education) are incorporated into the S2 curriculum. Students will have project work in which their creativity and problem-solving skills can be enriched.
- (c) We have joined the EDB Sister School Program. Our sister school is a foreign language school in Shenzhen (Shenzhen Pingshan New Area Tongxin Foreign Language School). We are planning to arrange a visit for all S3 students to the school in April 2018.
- (d) Career and multiple pathways are always our main focus for senior form students. The school keeps on exposing students to various career opportunities and providing students with work experiences via immersion programmes with nongovernment organizations and corporations.

With the joint effort of teachers and parents, I am confident that we can create the best learning environment for our students.

While there is no hidden "secret" to do well in the DSE there are a few tips and things to keep in mind.

First, the most important thing is not to lose hope. Have a little faith in yourself. Eventually dedication trumps talent, so even if you feel like you are not the best, don't give up,



just work harder. Second, set a schedule and abide by it. Having a good habit and being consistent is very important because motivation only lasts for a while. Building up a proper habit is more permanent. That means no cheat days; it will mess up your habit. Third, get rid of distractions and temptations. Try to set up a quiet study area. You could go to a public study room for a change. Fourth, spend half of your time studying books and concepts and the other half doing past papers. The past papers are very helpful, don't undermine them. Fifth, time yourself while you're doing the past papers because during the real exam you will probably understand how to answer most of the questions but won't have enough time. You could lose a lot of marks due to this. Sixth, for maths multiple choice questions, program your calculator with extra equations to solve them faster.

That is all the advice I can think of, hope it helps and good luck for the DSE.

I would like to share with you some useful tips to achieve good results in the HKDSE.

First of all keep reminding yourself that it's never too late to start revision. Never let anyone tell you otherwise. Your continuous hard work and determination is the key to success no matter what your goal is. Start off with doing DSE past papers, do as many past papers as you can, minimum 5 to 7 years, perhaps 5 to 7



times for each paper. Try to memorize the answer scripts to familiarize yourself with the answering techniques. Also, read former candidates' answer sheets on the HKDSE Website to learn their exam skills. Then you will become a more competitive candidate. There will be many questions that you have never come across and you do not know how to answer. You need to arrange a tutorial time with your teachers. You can ask your teachers to do past papers during the lessons and it will save you a lot of time doing them yourself. Make yourself a timetable and follow it strictly. It will take some time, but eventually you will get used to it. Take good care of your health. Eat healthy food and do some exercise because you do not want to fall sick in such a critical period.
